"Assorted "Mailer boxes/ sleeves"

Free to a good home [evidence required]. I have the following mailing boxes/sleeves that members might make use of. *They would be particularly useful for storing unmounted prints*.

- 20 boxes -310mm X 220mm When made up they have a depth of 50mm. They comfortably take A4 paper.
- 12 boxes 430mm X 310mm When made up they have a depth of 55mm. They comfortably take A3 paper.
- 8 boxes 615mm X 436mm When made up they have a depth of 55mm. They comfortably take A2 paper.
- 10 sleeves 450mm X 325mm Sealed on 3 sides so they have no "depth" They comfortably take A3 paper.




