What are your hobbies?

Photography, travel and gardening. Also follow the sharemarket.

How long have you been a member of the club?

16 years in Doncaster Club. I also belonged to the Warragul Club for seven years in the 1960's.

How did you get into Photography?

I was always interested in photography and used my mother's Box Brownie in my teens. When I married, my husband worked in the photography industry, so I had access to good 35mm cameras. Over the years we did a lot of photography in Australia and overseas for tourism, travel companies and some airlines. We also ran a successful image library for 30 years.

What Camera do you use and why?

I use a Canon 5D SR because it has a large file capture allowing me to crop in easily if I need to. My favourite lens is 17-40mm. It is good for landscapes and when I am shooting in the city it is the only one, I carry. I also have a Lumix FZ1000 which I bought to take to Macquarie Island, didn't want to risk the Canon in the Zodiac. It has a fixed lens, 24-400 zoom, is light weight but the quality is not up to Canon.

When it comes to photography, what do you consider your strengths?

I have always loved shooting landscapes and seascapes, especially ones with moody light. Rural images were my speciality for the image library as I understood farm animals. In recent years I have become more interested in architecture, with lines and shapes.

What area would you like to improve?

I would like to get my head around using layers!!

What is one goal you want to accomplish as a member of this team for this year?

Help to organise more outings as members seem to really enjoy them.

What is something that DCC members do not know about you?

As a teenager I made most of my own clothes because I couldn't afford to buy them. Even fancy ones for the occasional country Ball. I also did lots of knitting and embroidery and often entered them in the Warragul Show. The highlight of my embroidery was being awarded a Highly Commended for a Petit Point Tapestry I entered in the Royal Melbourne Show.

What is your favourite part of being a member of the club?

The club has been like a second family for me, and I have made some wonderful friends along the way.
