Here is the definition of "Motion" for the August Competition.

Motion in photography is a technique of showing movement in a still image. It can be achieved by using a longer shutter speed, multiple exposures, or capturing a gesture. Motion in photography can tell a story, set the mood, reflect a situation, or express an emotion. Motion in photography can make the images more dynamic and interesting. It may include waterfalls, someone running, birds in flight; anything that conveys a sense of movement and/or motion.

Name Pam Rixon

What are your hobbies? Photography, Tennis, Walking, Travel.

How long have you been a member of the club? 18 years membership and over 10 years as Secretary.

How did you get into Photography?

I begged for my first camera when I was 12 and was given a second-hand box brownie. At 14 I was given a very basic Kodak Instamatic. But then I couldn't afford the film or developing. Plus, I was disappointed in the quality of photos that came out of that camera.

I also played around with movie cameras at school and University. Eventually I bought a Pentax SLR for photographing my children.

I feel like I have always had cameras but not always the time to use them to the extent I would like.

What Camera do you use and why?

I now use a Canon R5 mirrorless – mostly. I have played around with other models and brands, but I seem to always go back to a Canon. I enjoy the image stabilization and high pixel count of the R5 which allows considerable cropping. Therefore, it is forgiving when my composition is not quite right or I am running with a high ISO.

My favourite lens is my Canon wide angle 14 to 35 mm. It is super sharp, and I enjoy shooting at 14mm and 35mm.

When it comes to photography, what do you consider your strengths?

Landscapes and Seascapes, Architecture and some street photography.

I have a reasonable grasp of Adobe photoshop and Lightroom.

I love printing my photos and consider a successful print as an achievement.

What area would you like to improve?

I would like to improve my bird photography but first I need to work on my patience and carry a heavy lens.

What is one goal you want to accomplish as a member of this team for this year?

I want to organise more group outings and provide Club members with the opportunity to challenge themselves in learning new skills with the camera and in post-production.

I want to get back to making AVs and photobooks. But I doubt that will happen this year.

What is something that DCC members do not know about you?

I always wanted to be a photographer, but my parents said it was a hobby not a real job.

Therefore, I got a degree in Social Work and Psychology instead and photography was my hobby.

The other thing is that I hate sitting in front of a computer for too long. I have worked on this and about one hour is now my limit. Then I need to do something active.

I wish I could do longer as then I could get to my thousands of photos that need editing.

What is your favourite part of being a member of the club?

The many friends I have made and groups I have joined.
