Well, the football is over for another year. Congratulations to the Brisbane Lions and their followers at DCC.

There was a good turn-up at the September meeting, and those present enjoyed viewing some interesting images from members participating in the set subject “Dawn & Dusk”. Adjudicated by Peter Layton, Robbie Carter and Peter Salter, it was interesting to learn that Peter Layton assessed that almost 70% of the images could have benefited from some cropping, to strengthen their presentation to the viewer. It was a pity that we could not organise for individual images to be shown to the authors with relevant crops applied; however, overall, a good night was had by all.

On the following Tuesday, Peter Layton introduced the first Zoom meeting of the reconvened Image Development SIG. With good attendance, this was a very instructional evening. “In-depth” discussion on cropping of images, as well as Peter Salter’s amazing work on turning an ordinary snapshot into a stunning B&W portrait image, was impressive. It goes to show, as Peter Stone has mentioned, don’t be too quick to discard those “ordinary” photos!!

The Mono SIG continues to go from strength to strength. The next session is scheduled for late November. Once again, congratulations must go to Graham Kay for his management of the Mono SIG. He is integral to having a vibrant and educational group. Members regularly comment on how much they have learnt from these sessions.

As previously mentioned, there was a proposal to introduce a 4th competition section into the club. A motion was passed to investigate and draft a set of guidelines for the introduction of a ‘Creative’ Section into our competition categories. This category would allow for the inclusion of AI technology in images for the ‘Creative’ Category. This forms part of the intention to introduce another SIG, specialising in Creative Photography.

Peter Stone leads the sub-committee to draft a set of guidelines for this new category. As appropriate, the guidelines will be published for membership comment, before commitment and commencement in 2026.

As in 2025, the committee has selected 13 images for the club’s 2026 Calendar, which should be available by the end of October or early November. A great Christmas gift idea

Please remember our weekend away to Heathcote at the end of October to try out some Astrophotography skills. It should be a great weekend, with participants returning home with some different and interesting photographs.

A reminder to all members, the “Scavenger Hunt” is very much alive and kicking. Peter Stone would like members to submit their offerings as they are taken rather than lumber him with hundreds of images to sort out at the end of the year. Please submit your works of art to Peter as you capture them.

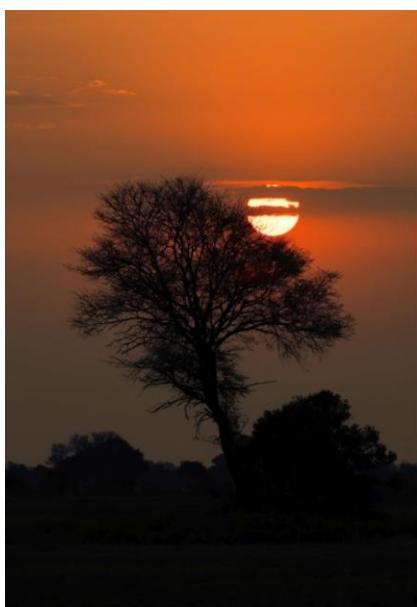

The judging of the set topic 'Dusk & Dawn' was conducted by Peter Layton, Robbie Carter and Peter Salter.

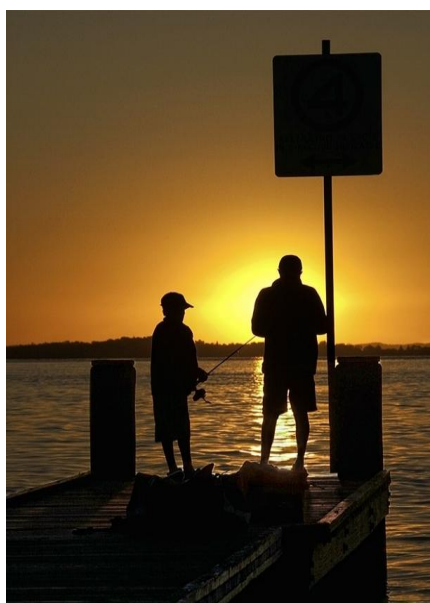

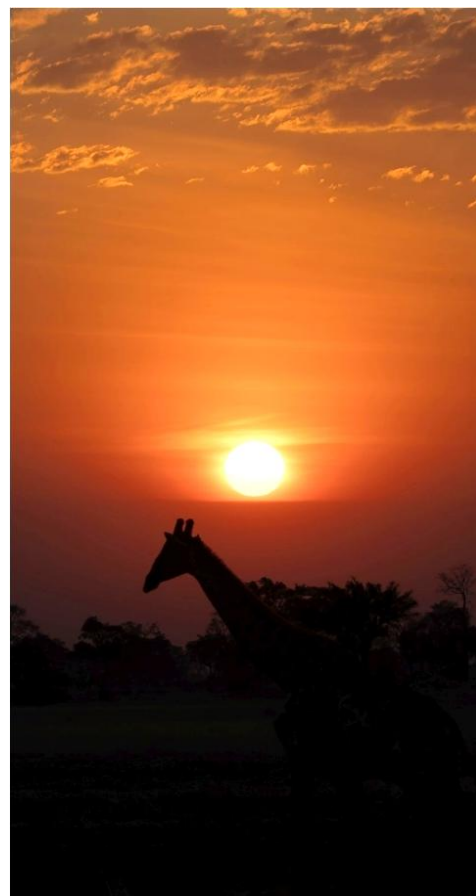

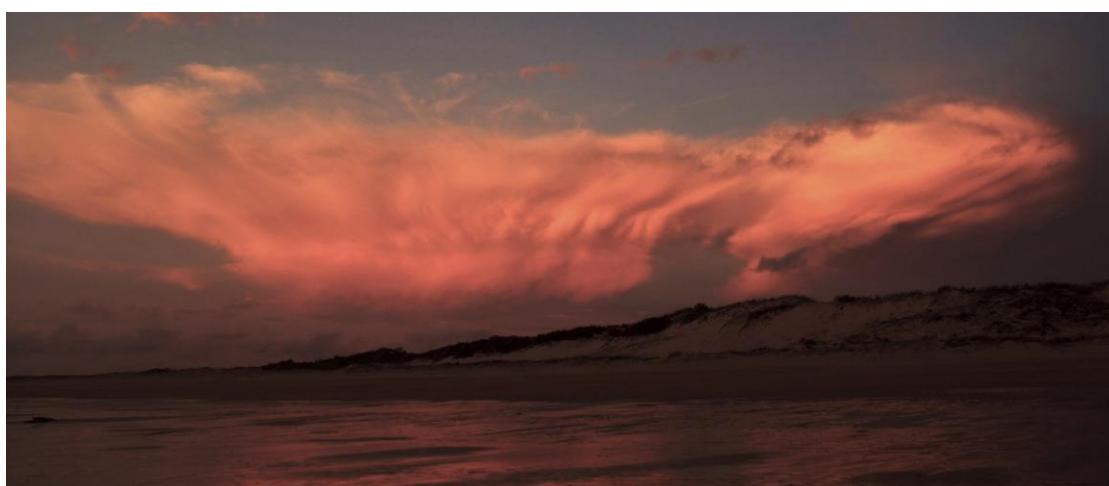

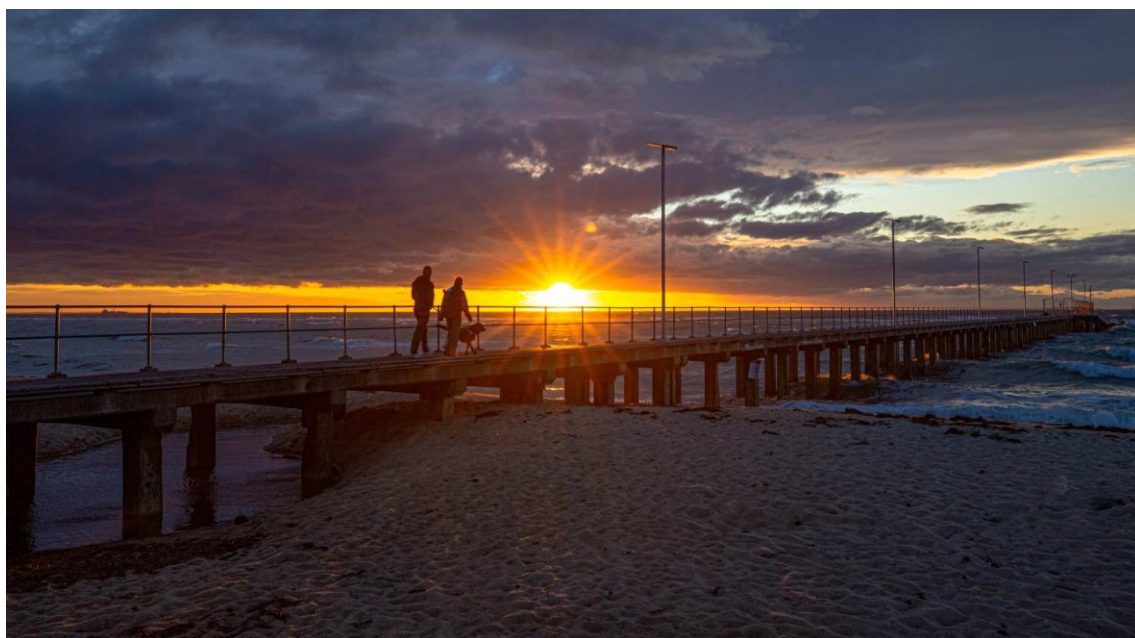

A FOND FAREWELL

Vale Lois Thompson (2/3/1929 ~ 7/9/2025)

On September 17th, Club members joined Lois' daughters, Rowena and Chris, at the Celebration of Lois' life.

Lois Thompson joined the Doncaster Camera Club in 1956, within months of the club commencing. Along with members of the extended Petty clan, Lois was a founding member of the club. Prior to that, Lois was a member of the Camberwell Camera Club, having joined in 1953. Lois was in her 70th year of membership at DCC and was our longest serving member.



Together with husband Denis, Lois was an integral part of the DC Club, serving on the DCC Committee from 1958 until 1975. Then again, in the 1980's, 1990's, and 2000's,

Lois was Club Secretary from 1961 - 1964, Social Secretary from 1971 -75 and again in the 1990's and 2000's. As a committee member Lois was involved in planning the program for very many years and judging at club competitions. As Social Secretary Lois organised most of the Club outings. She also organised many fundraising activities.

Lois received the DCC Presidents award in 1997, and in 2007 was awarded Life Membership of Doncaster.

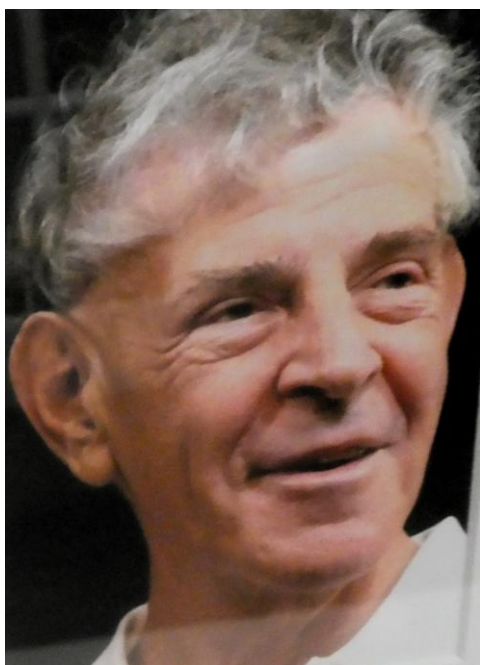
At the DCC's 70th anniversary lunch, in July this year, we were pleased to present Lois with a 70 Year Medallion in recognition of her 70 years membership in VAPS. The medallion was specially made by VAPS, Lois being the first member to achieve that milestone.

Lois was also a very talented artist and painted many artworks from her photographs.

At the October committee meeting the committee passed the following resolution: 'In recognition of Lois Thompson's seven decades of membership, support and dedication to the Doncaster Camera Club that the Denis Thompson Memorial Trophy Projected Image of the Year be renamed the Lois and Denis Thompson Memorial Trophy Projected Image of the Year.'

Name: **Felix Menke**

What are your hobbies?

Travel & Tourism, Golf, Trivia, Photography.

How long have you been a member of DCC.?

This is my second year at D.C.C. I was previously a member of the Eastern Suburbs Photographic Society for about seven years.

How did you get into photography?

I went overseas in 2016 and mucked up a lot of photos, because I had the camera at the wrong settings. I thought I had better learn more about cameras and

What camera do you use and why?

I use two cameras:

- a (Panasonic) Lumix G7 for long distance shots or shots requiring a tripod.
- a (Panasonic) Lumix DC-TZ99 which I take on my travels and have with me in case I see something I consider worth photographing.

I chose Lumix cameras because they have excellent German lenses from Karl Zeiss Jena.

When it comes to photography, what do you consider your strengths?

I guess that my wife, Pat, and I travel a lot, both within Australia and overseas. This enables me to take photos of places of interest, not frequently visited by D.C.C. members.

What area would you like to improve?

I would like to learn more about my cameras and how to use them effectively in different environments. I want to see, listen and learn.

What is one goal you want to accomplish as a member of the team for the year?

I have been fortunate enough to receive some Merits from various judges, but never an Honour; that's what I'm hoping for.

What is something the DCC Members do not know about you?

Throughout my life, I have been fortunate enough to:

- win *Sale of the Century*
- score a hole-in-one. (For about 10 seconds even Tiger Woods could not have done any better)
- work at the Sydney Olympics, driving the Softball Umpires around. (I am an Internationally accredited Softball Umpire myself).
- win a Bronze Medal in Softball as a pitching coach at the only Australia Games. (1985)

What is your favourite part of being a member of DCC?

The people. They have been most welcoming to me, and all the ex-members of the Easter Suburbs group. The D.C.C. members are very helpful and give excellent advice.

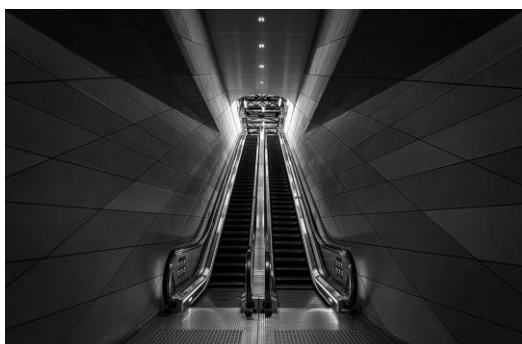

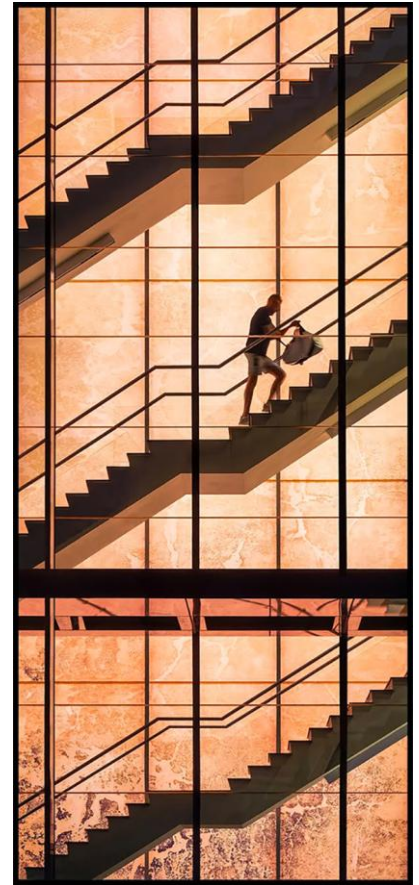
