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# 1 FROM THE PRESIDENT

#### New Club Logo

Welcome to the launch of the new DCC logo. The original plan for the launch included a cocktail party, champagne, finger food and entertainment by Michael Bublé. Unfortunately, we must forgo the festivities (Mr Bublé is disappointed).

The previous DCC logo was designed by club member Kevin McKay, possibly in the 70's. It has stood the Club in good stead for many decades. In these days of social media, and considering the developments in photography, the time had come to adopt a more modern and versatile logo.

The Committee called for logo submissions and ideas from within the club. We also leveraged a new relationship with the Box Hill Institute (BHI) Graphic Arts Department to have final year students work on the project and provide submissions.

The Committee considered 18 potential logos from 14 designers. At the first cut eleven submissions were culled. Of the final seven submissions, three were from DCC members and four from BHI students. Because club member submissions were included in the final seven the committee conducted a secret ballot to determine the final Logo.

The winning submission was by Geralyn Anderson from the Box Hill Institute.

The logo has been designed for use:

- in colour, on either a white or a coloured background
- in black and white
- as a logo and as an icon for use in social media; and
- as a water mark, if needed

In her submission the designer, Geralyn Anderson, told the committee:

'The logomark (icon) for Doncaster Camera Club utilises a well-known shutter design motif within the letter D. The letterform is uppercase and in a bold and simple sans-serif typeface, making it clear to decipher. It is legible, whether minimised or blown up, as required, and holds its form as a contemporary icon.

The omission of other possible letters ('C' as in 'DCC') places the emphasis on 'Doncaster,' as distinct from other regional camera clubs.

While the logomark is not symmetrical in the traditional sense, it is well-balanced. It can stand on its own as a monogram or watermark for use on social media, and when converted into a letterhead or header image for the website, etc. it is paired with the typeface in its regular weight. This shows the versatility of the logo as adaptable to different media, a sign of a brand's strength'.

Geralyn graduated from BHI the week after her submission was accepted. DCC has received this professionally designed logo, with full rights, at no cost. We have provided Geralyn with approval to use the logo in her portfolio of works, and we wish her well with her new business, Summa Grafika.

I want to thank Graham Kay, Peter Layton, Peter Stone and Kevin Wilson for their time and effort in producing submissions for this process.

The next steps in launching the logo will be the Website, Facebook, Instagram and Letterhead. The various logos can be seen at the end of the newsletter.

#### Interclub 10 Club Portrait Competition

The President, in his column, detailed the results of the Portrait competition conducted by Camberwell Camera Club. As an editorial addition to those results, I would like to offer the following. By comparison to several of the clubs who were participants in the competition, Doncaster is a relatively small club.

Albeit we had a good number of Portrait entries for our internal competition, the limitations placed on entries for the interclub (maximum of two entries per person) meant we could only submit 26 images. By comparison, Camberwell had so many participants they limited their entries to one per person and still entered 30 images. If we had been able to get another 4 entries our placing might have been a little higher!

This competition will be run again by Camberwell in June next year, so we have plenty of time to hone our portrait photography and ensure we have many quality images to choose from next time round.
