A Reminder - Set Topic - Animals for February Competition

Any living creature including birds, insects, reptiles, amphibians but excluding humans.

Tip 1: Wait for the subject to be facing their head/body toward the camera - avoid rear ends. Place your focus on the eye/s of the animal, ensure eyes are sharp.

Tip 2: Think outside the square. Think of what everyone else will photograph then do something DIFFERENT.
