What are your hobbies? Photography is my remaining hobby. Renovating houses and breeding English Springer Spaniels are in the past for me now.

How long have you been a member of the club? I joined DCC in 2013. I was briefly a member about ten years earlier, but struggled to engage with the club while I was working. I joined the Committee as Treasurer in 2016 and became the President in 2019 (through to 2023).

How did you get into Photography? My interest commenced when I took a Miranda 35mm film camera, and twin lens kit, to England in 1977. I never engaged in developing photos, so it was not a serious hobby. In 2003 I bought a Sony digital camera and Adobe Elements software for my new computer. Then I was hooked.

What Camera do you use and why? My first 'real camera' was a canon 5D DSLR (12.8Mp), followed by a Canon 1D, then a Canon 5DMkIV, and now a mirrorless Canon R5. I have three lenses, ranging from wide angle to a 100-500 Zoom. I love the hand hold ability from the stabilization in the canon R system.

When it comes to photography, what do you consider your strengths? Jack of all trades, master of none! I can do a pretty good job of cloning. I enjoy the intricate detail of making the cloning look like it never happened. What is one goal you want to accomplish as a member of this team for this year?

What is one goal you want to accomplish as a member of this team for this year? To learn more about Lightroom.

What is something that DCC members do not know about you? In 1977, I acted as Santa Claus in the toy department at Harrods of London. I convinced a seven-year-old visitor from Black Rock in Melbourne that I used the clock tower, by the bay in Black Rock, to navigate the reindeer to his house. I think he still believes in Father Christmas.

What is your favourite part of being a member of the club? The club competition and the Special Interest Groups provide the two essential elements for any photographer - learning and practice. Added to that, the friendly and convivial nature of the membership is most enjoyable.
