#### 1 FROM THE PRESIDENT

Hello DCC Members

As I am writing this, Victoria is moving to stage 4 restrictions for five days. Hopefully, that will resolve the problem. It highlights the fact that all plans are tentative in 2021. This is the new 'Covid normal' and flexibility is the key.

That said, we are attempting to move the club back to a normal footing.

Most Camera Clubs have returned to in-room meetings in 2021. Our intention is to run the April AGM at the Baptist Church. The church has a Covid Safe plan. We will be using the church hall to facilitate social distancing. There will be specific protocols in place to ensure everyone's safety.

We will commence operation of the Visual Pursuits (VP) software in the new club year. Competition entries in March will be the perfect opportunity to practice uploading images directly into VP. Entries in April will have to be uploaded to VP.

Graham Kay has sent an instruction on up-loading images. If you encounter any difficulties, contact Graham on 0403 199 713, Michael on 0412 252 387 or Liz on 0419 748 319. We can facilitate training via Zoom if required.

From the AGM, we will resume judging Prints. Print entries will be a maximum of three small prints and three open prints per member. During the past year the maximum number of DPI entries was increased to four. For the next year DPI entries will remain at the maximum of four.

The new club year will also see the implementation of the 15-point scoring system. Guest judges will score from 15 points. Internal judging panel members each judge out of 15, and the scores will then be averaged.

The club is putting the final touches to a Photographic Course which should be available from July. The course will be delivered in four units. We are seeking interest from any members who would like to be involved in the delivery of the units. If so, please contact Judy Mitchell. The coarse cost for members is \$30.00. Non-members will pay \$100.00 and receive a bonus membership until the following AGM.

The SCENIC group is planning an evening expedition to the Frankston foreshore on Sunday 28 February. Attendance is not restricted to members of the Scenic group and I encourage everyone to join in to come along.

The 2021 VAPS Conference will be held at Wangaratta on the 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> of June. Some members are already booking accommodation for the weekend. I will be going and conducting a drive around the nearby painted silo trail on the Sunday afternoon. I hope to see you there. DCC will be submitting DPI's and AV's to the VAPS Interclub Competition. 





Darkroom Chemical Storage Bottles and Beakers


#### A Blast from the Past

Ean had created seven interesting images. All had a good deal of excellent postproduction using layers, distortion, altering colour or removing certain elements.

Judy M succeeded in her aim of making all her shapes symmetrical. She mixed some wonderful details of architecture from past travels with household items, plant life and a very obliging lizard.

Kay mixed lines and shapes from around the building and included a couple discovered in Christmas decorations.

Bev included a mixture, deeming some pretty and others ugly, although some disputed her view of ugly. The way she had presented the shapes of electricity pylons did not make particularly ugly images.

Peggy shared some shapes found during the past month: at home, in the playground with her young granddaughter and at Chelsea beach. A summary of her present life.

And June shared geometric shapes found in household objects and daisies, along with others she'd created arranging similarly coloured buttons on a sheet of paper she had first decorated with a winding pencil line.
